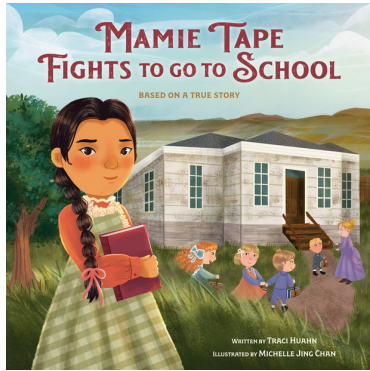


Book a School Visit with Author Traci Huahn

Centering themes of bravery and persistence, students will come away inspired by the little-known history of 8-year-old Chinese American changemaker Mamie Tape's fight to attend school and the aftermath of her 1885 California Supreme Court case, *Tape v. Hurley*.

Interactive presentation includes read-aloud of the book and behind-the-scenes look at the research, writing, and illustration process, plus time for Q&A. Designed for Grades 2-4, but suitable for K-5.

Add-on modules may include writing exercises, art projects, or other activities that take a deeper dive into the book's themes.
